


Adoptable Dogs

River has gained weight, is working on visual commands, and formed a special bond with his foster sister, Daisy. He loves little dogs, big dogs, and is good with her cat as well! Juliet raves about his gentle demeanor, impeccable manners, intelligence and desire for learning commands, and unwavering affection for both humans and animals. River's playful spirit and love for cuddles make him an absolute joy to be around. Despite being deaf, he's proving to be a quick learner, excelling in potty training and responding beautifully to sign language. River's magnetic personality has charmed everyone he meets, and he's now ready to

embark on his next adventure: finding a loving forever home where he'll continue to spread happiness and bring endless smiles.

Meet Josie - sweet beauty! We pulled beautiful Josie from a crowded shelter where she had been sitting past the stray hold without anyone coming to look for her. She walks well on leash, like to keep her yard clear of small furry creatures (squirrels beware!) and knows some basic commands. She is very food motivated and takes treats gently. She makes the best snorty sounds like a big velvet piggy and keeps us all laughing. During her stay with us, Starla has made several dog friends and is a great pack walker. She has been very tolerant of some of the younger, exuberant dogs once she knows them as long as they don't get slobber on her outfit

(she's good at doing that herself ⁽²⁾). She would love a quiet, adult family that will give her a good balance of play time, couch time, a reasonable monthly allowance to buy cool outfits and treats.

Meet Petey, a very handsome and affectionate three-legged 5-year-old male neutered pit bull, with a heart of gold! His story is upsetting because it is hard to imagine that this sweet boy, who adores human company and is so eager to please, has been confined to a kennel for the past 4 years. Petey was found as a stray by animal control as a young dog. Petey was emaciated, with a hind leg that was so severely injured that it required amputation. Thanks to the vet hospital that brought him in, he was spared euthanasia and received the necessary care. Despite this, his journey to find a loving home hit roadblocks. He next went to a boarding facility without much exposure to potential adopters, and Petey remained unclaimed. With the closure of this facility, Petey faces an uncertain future once again. The stress of confinement is taking a toll—he gets so excited to go on his walks, but



returning to his kennel is hard for him. While Petey is fantastic with adults, he would thrive in a pet-free environment without young children. He craves an active owner who enjoys walks and can dedicate time to his continued training. Although he's made impressive strides in leash manners, his strength sometimes gets the better of him, needing ongoing work in this area. He's up-to-date on vaccinations, heartworm tested, dewormed, neutered, and microchipped. As you can tell from his pictures, Petey's eyes are so expressive; and communicate his deep longing for a place to call his own—a fenced in yard to frolic in and someone to shower him with love! It's awe-inspiring how, despite all the hardship he has been through, he is still so trusting and sweet. We have met Petey and want to help find him a great home. He will be a great companion!

Rosie is house trained and command trained, however she is very dog reactive despite having been to formal training. Her owners are devastated that they need to rehome her due to this issue because they have 2 babies in a stroller and cannot manage the walks safely for Rosie. They also do not have a proper backyard which has also increased the challenge of getting Rosie out to use the bathroom and exercised. Rosie has some allergies which are under control and can be further discussed upon inquiries. Rosie deserves a home where she is loved, cared for and

number one with people who have patience, and a backyard for her to get outside and play. She deserves a home where she can live and be happy. Although she is loved so very much, they can no longer provide her with basic daily exercise. They are hoping to rehome this gentle giant Rosie, to the right people who will love her unconditionally and have the right conditions for her to live her best life. They know Rosie will not do well in a shelter, even a no kill, because of her dog reactiveness and are desperately trying to find her a foster/new home instead of putting her in a situation in which she will just deteriorate. Meet Dharma and Greg are a dynamic duo who are ready for their forever home! They will need someone with patience, as they start out shy but they may very well end up as cuddlers with enough



time. In the meantime, they will entertain you with their antics! Both are fixed and up to date on shots. 1 to 1 1/2 years old. Dharma is missing one eye, but that doesn't slow her down.

Meet sweet Jewel who was found riding in a car engine. We don't know where she originated from, but when we had her examined, we found that she had already been spayed and even ear tipped, so she could have been part of a trap, neuter and release program. She was tested and vaccinated and given a

clean bill of health. We also had her vaccinated. She is estimated to be a young adult, maybe 2-3 years old. Jewel is so grateful to be safe and sound in her foster home. She is the sweetest kitty, well behaved and affectionate. She gets along well with the foster's small dog. We are not sure how she would be around other cats. If you decide to bring Jewel into your home and heart, you will not be disappointed!





Meet Papas! Papas was a stray cat that was hanging around the neighborhood for a while. He is estimated to be around 4 or 5 years old. He seems to have been tossed out at some point because he is friendly. The finder/feeder brought him in and asked us for help. After examination and testing, Papas was found to be FIV+, has some irregularities with his kidney function and also a heart murmur. He also had a blood parasite which caused him to be anemic and he went through treatment for that. After a month of intensive care, he gained weight, his kidneys normalized for the most part and he was cleared of the parasite and red blood cells elevated. He also had an EKG and is on one pill for his heart condition. We keep him on a kidney diet and supplements

to support him and he gets his heart pill every day. Papas has been in a room alone through all of this so we don't know how he would do around other cats. He also will need an EKG every year to track his heart condition. We are looking for a permanent foster or adopter for this sweet fellow who deserves the loving comforts in a home. We will continue to provide the medical care for Papas if you decide to take him into your heart and home.

Meet TC, a special-needs, 6-year-old, beautiful petite cat with the prettiest golden eyes. She is quiet, a little shy, moderately playful, and a very easy, mellow girl. She is spayed, vetted, and she does not have

front claws. Sadly, she is FIV + and has a congenital deformity of both rear legs that is not easily operable and been evaluated medically and they could not find any pain. She gets around with no problem despite her distorted walk, has no issues at all using her litter box, and it doesn't stop her from playing! TC likes petting and will roll around in front of you, smush her head in the palm of your hand, but doesn't always like her back petted. PLEASE don't let any of this stop you! She is a sweet girl and just wants a loving home to relax in. TC's elderly



owner has medical issues that are interfering with their ability to keep TC safe so we are seeking a home that will accept her for who she is. She has never been around other animals so not sure how she would do. She is fully vetted, spayed, litter box trained. Pet insurance active and will be paid for TC entire life.

Christine was amazing as usual with her help and between the family and Christine, a wonderful new home was chosen for Rocky. The new family had previous experience with the breed and were so excited to welcome Rocky into their home. **Hailey** It doesn't get much better than this! PAWS pulled Hailey, a 13-year-old dog, from AHS-Newark Branch just yesterday. Hailey had landed at AHS after her owner passed away. Rescue coordinator Sherri Powell Laraway, who has an especially soft heart for the seniors, notified us about her and we pulled her. And then, a call came into Sherri from a couple who were interested in Hailey. Since she was now with PAWS, they submitted an application to us. We contacted them immediately, and what we learned was astonishing... Susan and Bill had known Hailey since she was a pup -- turns out they had been a part of a group of dog lovers that included Hailey's owner, who would regularly meet up at their local dog park. When they found



out about Hailey's owner's passing, they tried to find where she had gone -- they got conflicting stories from some sources but they finally found out she had been taken to the Newark shelter, and Sherri then directed them to PAWS.

They wanted to adopt her so she could live out her golden years with them! ...When they came to pick up Hailey, all three of them were visibly excited -- the connection was amazing! Hailey realized who they were, and watching it unfold was one of those joyful moments that you wish would happen for every rescue animal. Unfortunately, many times, family members won't even take a dog who is left after the death of another family member. But here, these wonderful people stepped up - actually searched to find and take in Hailey. Rescuer Yasmin was called; she, in turn, called the Newark police who are always helpful to her in these situations, and even brought Tito a blanket to keep warm while transport was arranged. Seeing Yasmin's post, one of our fosterers contacted Carole at PAWS to see if we could take him into her home, which, of course, we did. Tito was so friendly and so happy to be in a warm home, met Juliet's resident dogs after we had him vetted and neutered, and soon, Gina and Ryan contacted us with an application and hopes to adopt! Turns out Gina's sister, Julia, was a former PAWS adopter – small world – and off Tito, renamed Tommy, went to his new home. He is thriving and loving life like never before with this awesome couple. **Charlie:** We are thrilled to announce that Charlie, an exceptional dog, has been adopted! PAWS had rescued Charlie from an inner-city shelter in 2021 and he was adopted into a wonderful home. Sadly, the





owner passed away. Now, Charlie has a new life and lots to look forward to with his new person,






Check out these books by local authors.
